Stained Glass Project Update:

Our President Michael Kitch received a call at 3pm yesterday from the Associated Crafts Stained Glass Window Studio whom we have contracted with for repairs to our stained glass windows. And they were good enough to call us and share that the prices that we had quoted will be going up in the new year and so to lock in the price they would need a payment of \$29,610 before the new year. The Good news is that we have already raised \$20, 411 toward the project, so that means we are \$9199 short. We have had some step forward who

are willing to donate toward locking in the price, however we need additional donations to get to this goal. On the one hand it is a very difficult ask, but at the same time we will save money in added costs in the long term. Work will not be able to begin until next fall at the earliest. Psalm 96 ¹ O sing to the LORD a new song; sing to the LORD, all the earth. ² Sing to the LORD, bless his name; tell of his salvation from day to day.

³ Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous works among all the peoples.
⁴ For great is the LORD, and greatly to be praised; he is to be revered above all gods.

⁵ For all the gods of the peoples are idols, but the LORD made the heavens.

⁶ Honor and majesty are before him; strength and beauty are in his sanctuary. ⁷ Ascribe to the LORD, O families of the peoples, ascribe to the LORD glory and strength.

⁸ Ascribe to the LORD the glory due his name; bring an offering, and come into his courts.

⁹ Worship the LORD in holy splendor; tremble before him, all the earth.

Say among the nations, "The LORD is king! The world is firmly established, it shall never be moved. He will judge the peoples with equity."

Let the heavens be glad, and let the earth rejoice; let the sea roar, and all

that fills it;

12 let the field exult, and everything in it. Then shall all the trees of the forest sing

for joy

13 before the LORD; for he is coming, for he is coming to judge the earth. He will judge the world with righteousness, and the people with his truth.

This was the Psalm that we read responsively on Christmas Eve. This Psalm calls on the whole earth and all the nations to sing praises to God.

In John's Gospel we hear the placing of the coming of the Word in the context of Creation, in the beginning. And John instead of painting the picture of Jesus at his birth in Bethlehem; places this same Word made flesh in the beginning with God in creation. This same baby born in a manger who was given the name Jesus, Lord just like God, the same Lord referred to in this Psalm.

Christ was born of Mary and Joseph in a makeshift shelter outside the village of Bethlehem, when Quirinius was governor of Syria. This Lord is both local and cosmic in His being. You see the good news of the Christmas Gospel is for the whole world, but it also demands especially the attention of what is going on around us, in our homes, in our congregation, in our community in our daily lives.

In this Christmas season and into the new year let us make this story our story, not only the story of Christ in the beginning as the Word, but also the story of the Nativity and his life, death and resurrection and this Hymn of Praise from Psalm 96, the enthronement of our Lord.

Our Lord in Creation, in His Life and Death and especially the New beginning of the Resurrection and his coming to forgive, judge and save. The Alpha and Omega (Beginning and the End) God with us!

December Church Council Meeting Minutes

The St. Olaf Lutheran Church council met on December 12, 2023.

Present: Michael Kitsch, Mike Boehmer, Kristi Trottier, Colette Boehmer, Louise Oleson, Jeri Steffan, Daria Miller, Crystal Eversvik, Pastor Lori Pankratz, Kelly Longden, Darci Gilbertson. Not Present: Evonne Geigle. Visitors: Pastor JoHanna Buchholz, members of Our Savior's Lutheran Church council - Char Burthold, Susan Britsch, Amber Lambrecht, Kari Kempel

President Michael Kitsch called the meeting to order at 5:00 pm. Pastor Lori opened with a prayer.

Pastor Lori and Pastor JoHanna led a conversation with council members about the possibility of sharing a youth ministry coordinator in the future. No decision was made at this time. Dialog concerning this will continue between the two churches. St. Olaf will move forward to seek a full time youth ministry coordinator to fill the position vacated by Kelly Longden.

The minutes of the November council meeting were reviewed. Mike moved to approve the minutes. Crystal seconded. The minutes were approved.

Mike presented the Treasurer's report. Balances as of November 30, 2023 - Designated Funds: \$78,394.45; Building Fund: \$39,865.80; General Fund: \$2058.52. The line of credit is nearing pay off.

Activity reports from Pastor Lori and Kelly Longden were reviewed.

Christian Education: Kristi reported that they had a joint meeting with Youth & Family Ministry. They discussed the possibility of a youth ministry coordinator with Our Savior's. They are preparing for the Christmas Nativity play. Rachel Kitsch has been added as a member of this board.

Church Properties: No report at this time. Pastor Lori will reach out to Evonne for information from this board.

Life in Ministry & Mission: Louise reported that the Confirmation youth made cookies to give to nursing home residents. Pastor Lori, Louise, and Jayne continue their visits to the nursing care facilities.

Stewardship: Jeri inquired how much money is still needed to pay for the elevator upgrade/repair. Approximately \$34,000 is needed to complete the elevator fund.

Youth & Family Ministry: Crystal reported that Ashley Samuelson has joined this board. Crystal reported that they will be working on projects with the Christian Ed board. Both boards will do what they can to fill in after Kelly leaves his position.

Worship & Music: Daria reported that Jean Aardahl is resigning from this board. Daria questioned if there is a need for the Worship & Music board. No action at this time.

Unfinished Business: No update on the elevator at this time. Michael reported that the price for repairing the stained glass windows remains the same, but we are encouraged to sign a contract soon to lock in the current price. St. Olaf member, Brian Miller, made beautiful wooden magnets for purchase with all money raised going to the stained glass window fund. A building use policy is needed for the Sons of Norway and any other group that may use our church facilities. Louise and Michael will work on writing a policy.

New Business: Darci requested a change in names be made to the ND Secretary of State Annual Report. Mike moved to place the name of Pastor Lori Pankratz on the ND Secretary of State Annual Report and to remove the name of Evan Markestad. Kristi seconded. The motion was approved. Mike presented the 2024 Mission Plan to the council. He reported that several church members helped with the plan. Mike reviewed and highlighted a few of the changes on the Mission Plan. Louise moved to accept the 2024 St. Olaf Mission Plan. Colette seconded the motion. Following discussion, the council voted and the 2024 Mission Plan was approved as presented.

The meeting was adjourned. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
