Vacation Time: 2 weeks a year after successful performance evaluation.



Wednesdays Lenten Series starts March 5




"The Lord is near to the broken-hearted and saves the crushed in spirit."

St Olaf Lutheran Fellowship Hall (Facilitated by Pr. JoHanna Bucholz, Our Saviors and Pr. Lori Pankratz, St. Olaf)

Join us for 6 weeks as we explore the life and theology of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, and the lessons we can use as we live at the intersection of faith and civic life today. Bonhoeffer was a Lutheran pastor and theologian living in Nazi Germany, who eventually joined the resistance and was arrested and killed before the end of WWII. This curriculum was compiled by Dr. Lori Brandt Hale, an internationally renowned Bonhoeffer scholar and president of the International Bonhoeffer Society – English Language Section.

Lutheran Advocacy Ministry in Pennsylvania is a partner in distributing to congregations to inspire deeper conversation and discernment about how we live as disciples.

The St. Olaf Lutheran Church council met on February 11, 2025.

President Dave Oehlke called the meeting to order at 5:30pm. Pastor Lori read a prayer "Before Reading the News".

The minutes of the January 2025 council meeting were reviewed. Michael moved to accept the minutes. Louise seconded. The minutes were approved.

The Treasurer's report was prepared by Mike Boehmer. Copies were reviewed by the council. Balances as of January 31, 2025, were as follows: Designated Funds: \$95,702.80; Building Fund: \$2,257.22; General Fund: \$8,041.76; Contingency: Fund: \$17,508.80; Window Fund:

\$4,585.43. Anne moved to accept the re-

port. Kristi seconded. The treasurer's re-

port was approved.

Pastor Lori presented her report. Lent will begin on Ash Wednesday, March 5. The Lenten theme will be Broken and Beloved. St. Olaf youth will participate in skits, there will be paint by number canvases for members to color, and the Holden Evening prayer will be used as the liturgy. Pastor Lori is looking for mentors for Confirmation students.

They will meet in groups on Wednesdays during Lenten suppers.

Christian Education / Youth & Family Ministry: Kristi reported that Lenten supper schedules have been made. Curriculum for Sunday school is being put together. Donations for Easter baskets would be appreciated.

Church Properties: Evan reported that he is looking to work closely with Kirk Sweeney on church maintenance. Evan will follow up on dishwasher and water softener issues.

Life in Ministry & Mission: Lousie explained her role as reaching out to members with visits, greeting cards, and phone

calls. She will be a Confirmation mentor and supports Pastor Lori and Darci when needed.

Stewardship: Michael reported that Jeri Steffan has agreed to work on Stewardship with him for 2025. They will be looking at membership lists for active and inactive members. This will be a starting point for a possible change to the church constitution regarding quorum.

Worship & Music: No committee members at this time.

Unfinished Business: Following a tabled decision on the AED purchases, with more information available, the council voted via email on January 21 and 22 to purchase two new AEDs with the DLAF grant of \$3826.00. Batteries and new pads will be purchased to upgrade one of the old AED machines. An additional \$1099.39 is needed to complete the purchase and upgrade.

New Business: Dave reported that he has been reviewing the insurance policy on the church building. He suggested that some changes may be needed. Dave and Evan will schedule a meeting with Dan Ness, the insurance representative.

The meeting was adjourned. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
