



Sept. & Oct. Council Meeting Minutes

The St. Olaf Lutheran Church council met at 5:00pm on Sept. 23, 2023.

Present: Michael Kitsch, Mike Boehmer, Colette Boehmer, Daria Miller, Jeri Steffan, Louise Oleson, Pastor Lori Pankratz, Kelly Longden, Darci Gilbertson. Absent: Kristi Trottier, Evonne Geigle, Crystal Eversvik. Visitor: Sharon Rance. President Michael Kitsch called the meeting to order. Pastor Lori led us in a devotion from Genesis 2:1-3. Following creation God rested and blessed the 7th day and we should also take time to rest, reflect, meditate, and pray.

The minutes of the August council meeting were reviewed. Mike moved to accept the minutes. Daria seconded. The minutes were approved.

Mike presented the treasurer's report. Balances as of August 31, 2023: Designated Funds: \$86,452.61; Building Fund: \$28,970.16; General Fund: negative balance (\$5,327.93). Mike informed the council that a \$10,000 line of credit will need to be drawn to meet payroll on September 29. \$25,000 a month in donations is needed to meet monthly expenses and payroll. Louise moved to accept the treasurer's report. Jeri seconded. The report was approved. Michael will present a Temple Talk during church service on October 1 to explain the needs of the church at present and to encourage giving.

Monthly reports from both Pastor Lori and Kelly were reviewed. Many ongoing job tasks and future projects are being worked on by both.

Sharon Rance, long time member of St. Olaf, met with the council to voice her concerns about the elevator maintenance/updates and the urgent need to move forward with repairs. Sharon is graciously leaving a wheelchair lift at the church to be used by anyone if and when the elevator may not be functioning. Sharon's caregiver was on hand to give us a demonstration on the use of the wheelchair lift.

Church Properties: Michael reported that a few water leaks in the church building were noticed following recent rainfall. Michael will relay information to Evonne, Church Properties chair, about this problem. No action was taken at this time. Life in Ministry & Mission: Pastor Lori reported that Jayne Mlynar is a new member to this committee. Youth & Family Ministry: The council reviewed minutes from the September 6 meeting of the committee. Worship & Music: Daria reported that the congregational response to the Psalm reading during Sunday service cannot be heard on the radio or Facebook since no one is reading the response verses into the microphone. Kelsie and Doris are available to fill in at the organ/piano as needed. Amanda Cory has resigned from this committee. No reports from Christian Education or Stewardship.

Unfinished Business: Elevator: Michael reported that the estimate from the Otis Elevator company for the updates and repairs still stands at \$78,000. A downpayment of \$39,000 (50% of total) is requested by the elevator company to begin work. When this payment is made the company will order the necessary parts. Manufacturing time for parts is 12 weeks. Estimated elevator downtime will be 3 weeks for the repairs and updates to be completed. Following discussion, the council agreed that the need for elevator repairs is of utmost importance. Michael will give a Temple Talk to explain the need for donations to the general fund and elevator repair downpayment. Sharon Rance also agreed to present a Temple Talk on the need for a functioning elevator and what St. Olaf church means to her. St. Olaf website: Michael will contact, Jace, who has been facilitating the website redesign to find out what is needed to finish this project. Stained Glass Windows: Pastor Lori and Darci reported that St. Olaf received a Nordic Church/Sacred Spaces Heritage Grant of \$15,000 for stained glass repair and restoration. This grant will need to be matched by donations. They recently attended a seminar on fundraising ideas and how to involve the community in this project.

New Business: Darci requested that Kathy Lovseth be added as a counter at 1st United Bank. Louise moved to add Kathy Lovseth to the St. Olaf list of counters at 1st United Bank. Daria seconded. The motion was approved.

The meeting was adjourned. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

The St. Olaf Lutheran Church council met on October 10, 2023.

President Michael Kitsch called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. Pastor Lori opened the meeting with a devotion from Genesis 4:1-10, the story of Cain and Abel. She encouraged us to be slow to anger, as God is slow to anger.

The minutes of the September council meeting were reviewed. Kristi moved to accept the minutes. Louise seconded. The minutes were approved.

Mike presented the Treasurer's report. Balances as of October 4, 2023 - Designated Funds: \$78,581.69; Building Fund: \$30,277.34; General Fund: \$120.09. Mike informed the council that a \$10,125.00 line of credit was drawn from 1st United Bank to make payroll at the end of September. The interest rate on this line of credit is 8%. Additional funds - Elevator: \$17,325.00; Stained Glass: \$12,721.00; Contingency: \$12,682.42. Mike noted that a group will meet on November 29 to work on the Mission Plan for 2024.

Reports from both Pastor Lori and Kelly were reviewed. They both listed many items of work and activity.

No reports from Christian Education, Church Properties, or Worship & Music at this time. Life in Ministry & Mission: Louise reported that she has been introducing the new member of this committee, Jayne Mlynar, to nursing home residents and shut ins that she ministers to. She has also been brainstorming ideas for future fundraising activities. Stewardship: Jeri reported that she met with Pastor Lori and Kelly. A letter regarding stewardship from Pastor Lori will be mailed to all members. Youth & Family Ministry: The minutes of this committee's October 4 meeting were reviewed by the council.

Unfinished Business: Elevator: Michael reported that he was in contact with Todd, the representative from the Otis Elevator company. As soon as the contract is signed and a downpayment of \$39,000.00 is made to Otis Elevator the ordering of supplies will commence. The council agreed that the need for this project to get started is of utmost importance. Colette moved to withdraw \$15,000.00 from the Building fund and \$5000.00 from the Contingency fund. This money will be added to the \$17,325.00 in the Elevator fund with an additional donation given at the meeting to meet the \$39,000.00 down-payment. Mike seconded the motion. The motion was approved. Michael, Mike, and Darci will work to get the contract signed and the check for \$39,000.00 ready and sent immediately. Stained Glass Windows: No report. Door: Michael will contact Quince at the Glass Shop to check on fixes to the south door (welcome center) on the church building.

New Business: Michael reported that Evonne reached out to an architect, recommended by the Sacred Spaces Heritage group, to do an assessment of the church building before going forward with the stained glass window repairs. This architect is unavailable at this time but recommended a couple roofing companies that could assess the leaks in the roof. Michael will ask Evonne to call roofing companies to get evaluations and estimates. In other new business, Pastor Lori reported that she was contacted by a representative from the local Sons of Norway group. They are looking for a new place to hold their meetings. Pastor Lori will invite a representative from this group to attend a future council meeting. The St. Olaf Lutheran church annual meeting has been set for January 21, 2024. The meeting was adjourned. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
