Mark 13:24-37 24 "But in those days, after that suffering, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, 25 and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. 26 Then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in clouds' with great power and glory. 27 Then he will send out the angels, and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven. 28 "From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. 29 So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he [a] is near, at the very gates. 30 Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. 31 Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. 32 "But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. 33 Beware, keep alert; [b] for you do not know when the time will come. 34 It is like a man going on a journey, when he leaves home and puts his slaves in charge, each with his work, and commands the doorkeeper to be on the watch. 35 Therefore, keep awake—for you do not know when the master of the house will come, in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or at dawn, 36 or else he may find you asleep when he comes suddenly. 37 And what I say to you I say to all: Keep awake."

As we prepare for Advent, let us reflect not only on the anticipation of the holiday season. Let us reflect on the coming of our Lord as a babe wrapped in swaddling clothes lying in a manger and as our Lord who has promised to come again to claim victory over death and evil. Both of these events, one history and one yet to come, usher in God's promises: something big, a love that changes everything. Immanuel, God with us!! This story illustrates what I mean.

An old pioneer traveled westward across the Great Plains until he came to an abrupt halt at the edge of the Grand Canyon. He gawked in amazement. The chasm was a mile down, eighteen miles across and more than a hundred miles long. He gasped, "Wow, something big musta' happened here!"

A visitor to our world at Christmas, seeing all the lights, the trees, the decorations, the parades, the festivities, the charitable actions and gifts, and all the religious services, probably would say the same thing: "Wow, something big musta' happened here!" And something big DID happen. God put on flesh and came into our world as one of us on the first Christmas. That event changed all of history.

Unfortunately, few were watching that night. People went about their business at home, in their shops, in the marketplace, while God was doing His greatest and most creative work right under their noses.

That's one reasons why Jesus says, "Watch! Be prepared!" Advent is a time of personal preparation for Christmas and when Christ comes again. And we have to be prepared if we want to see God's amazing work.

We have to stay awake and be alert so that Christmas can be meaningful. We have to prepare our hearts as well as our homes. O Come, O Come, Emmanuel!

November Church Council Meeting Minutes

The St. Olaf Lutheran Church council met on November 14, 2023.

Present: Michael Kitsch, Mike Boehmer, Colette Boehmer, Louise Oleson, Daria Miller, Crystal Eversvik, Pastor Lori Pankratz, Kelly Longden, Darci Gilbertson. Absent: Kristi Trottier, Evonne Geigle, Jeri Steffan. Guest: Kathy Gewont

President Michael Kitsch called the meeting to order at 5:00pm. Pastor Lori opened with a devotion and a prayer.

Pastor Lori introduced Kathy Gewont representing the local Sons of Norway Heim Lodge. Kathy presented a brief history and showed some historical items from the Heim lodge. She explained that the Heim Lodge is currently looking for a new place to hold meetings, store their various sized cabinets, and display historical artifacts.

Council discussion and decision was added to New Business.

The minutes of the October council meeting were reviewed. Crystal moved to accept the minutes. Louise seconded. The minutes were approved.

Mike presented the treasurer's report. Balances as of October 31, 2023 - Designated Funds: \$74,769.61; Building Fund: \$21,256.32; General Fund: \$2,078.62; Elevator Fund: \$15,406.00; Stained Glass Window Fund: \$20,221.76. St. Olaf church continues to carry a line of credit of \$10,000 + interest at First United Bank. Darci reported that St. Olaf received a check for \$2997.66 from the ELCA Foundation. This money was from a charitable gift annuity. Mike moved that the \$2997.66 be used as payment on the line of credit. Crystal seconded. The motion was approved.

Activity reports from Pastor Lori and Kelly were reviewed.

Life in Ministry & Mission: Louise reported that she traveled with Pastor Lori and Darci to Hampden to sample a Klub meal. This is in preparation for a possible fundraising Klub meal to be held in the spring of 2024. Louise will be sending Christmas cards as mission outreach. Louise and Jayne Mlynar continue to visit nursing home residents.

Youth & Family Ministry: Crystal reported that some members of this committee are no longer active. The Christian Ed board is seeing a similar trend. These two boards have decided to meet and work together on activities for the foreseeable future.

Worship & Music: Daria reported that Dianne Saele has resigned from this board. Since Pastor Lori meets with the worship team, is this board needed? The council did not take any action at this time.

No reports from Christian Education, Church Properties, and Stewardship.

Unfinished Business: Michael reported that Todd (Otis Elevator rep) informed him that additional electrical work will be needed for the updated fire alarm system. This electrical work is not included in the Otis Elevator contract. Michael will ask for bids for this additional electrical work. There is no update on the stained glass windows project.

New Business: Pastor Lori reported that the Devils Lake Area Foundation has grants available for local projects. Mike moved that St. Olaf apply for a \$5000.00 DLAF grant for the elevator project. Daria seconded. The motion was approved. Pastor Lori, Louise, and other members will work on the grant application. Louise moved to allow the Sons of Norway Heim Lodge to use the church's lower level for meetings and to allow storage of cabinets in Sunday school room #5 beginning in January 2024. Daria seconded the motion. The council discussed the unique opportunity this arrangement could mean to our Norwegian church community and the Devils Lake com-

munity. The council discussed possible rooms for the storage needs of the Sons of Norway. Sunday school room #5 is located on the lower level and is not being used at this time. Following discussion, the council voted to approve this motion. Kelly Longden presented his letter of resignation to the council. Mike moved to accept Kelly's resignation. Crystal seconded. Following expressions of thanks, sadness, and well wishes, the council approved the motion to accept Kelly's resignation.

The meeting was adjourned. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

*Coloring, Coffee and Conversation was held on November 9. This is always a quiet relaxing time. Thanks to Jean Aardahl for the planning and the Treats.


