

## **FAITH MATTERS**;

~ Pastor Lori ~

In recent weeks, we, as a community of faith have had many friends and relatives enter the hospital, and, as is with most things, modern healthcare has become a tangled web of rules and regulations, red tape and information blocks, even for those who work outside the hospitals themselves, like pastors. I know that many of us have heard a great deal about the "Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act", known to many of us as HIPAA. This is a law that prevents outside persons from coming to a health insurance company or healthcare facility and requesting information on another person's health history. It is meant to prevent information that could be used in a discriminatory fashion from getting out without a person's consent. And, due to the fairly comprehensive nature of this law, it can sometimes make things difficult when a member of our church goes into the hospital. Hence, I would like to offer a general reminder on how HIPAA effects pastoral care here at St. Olaf, and what that means for you or your family member if and when they are admitted to the hospital or nursing care facility.

As I am sure many of you remember, back in the day, and really not that long ago because even I remember when this was true, when a person was admitted to the hospital, the hospital would ask what religion or denomination a person belonged to and if they were a member of a local congregation. If a congregation was named, the hospital would then call that church and let the pastor know that a parishioner was in the hospital so they could visit. This is not so anymore. The only way that our church or myself can learn if someone is in the hospital and needs a visit, is if the patient or the family calls either the church, myself or another member of the congregation and lets them know; the hospital can no longer offer the information as they once did. When it comes to information about

surgeries and illness, information is often shared within the congregation, but discretion and privacy are always a good idea and I will always do my best to check with the family as to what information they are comfortable having shared. I will never assume something is public information, so, please rest assured that the information shared with me will remain confidential unless I am told otherwise.

Simply, what this all comes down to is that information, in healthcare settings, must now come from the patient and the patient's family first, rather than the institution itself. It can make things more complicated but it does not mean you cannot have the support and comfort you need, especially during tough times. All it takes is a phone call, a text, an email, or any other form of communication either directly with myself or the church office (but please note that if you want to reach me on the weekend please use my cell phone number).

I truly feel privileged to spend time with each and every one of you, particularly when there is a health scare, crisis, or a change in family dynamics. If you are ever in need of pastoral care, simply let me know. If you have any questions, feel free to ask. Also please do not assume I know that you or your loved one is in need of pastoral care or a visit or simply a call.

## January Church Council Meeting Minutes

The St. Olaf Lutheran Church council met on January 9, 2024.

Present: Michael Kitsch, Mike Boehmer, Colette Boehmer, Louise Oleson, Jeri Steffan, Crystal Eversvik, Pastor Lori Pankratz, Darci Gilbertson. Absent: Kristi Trottier.

President Michael Kitsch called the meeting to order at 5:05 pm. Pastor Lori opened with a devotion from Mark 6:1-13 - evangelism.

The minutes of the December 2023 council meeting were reviewed. Crystal moved to approve the minutes. Jeri seconded. The minutes were approved.

Mike presented the Treasurer's report. Balances as of December 31, 2023 - Designated Funds: \$80,334.98; Building Fund: \$37,006.34; General Fund: \$11,125.44.

Pastor's report: Pastor Lori reported that she had a busy December. Attendance for Christmas services was good. She presided at two funerals. She is reviewing and amending the Youth Ministry Coordinator job description.

No reports from Christian Education, Church Properties, Stewardship, and Worship & Music.

Life in Ministry & Mission: Louise reported that they sent Christmas cards to shut ins and non-active members. They continue with outreach visits.

Youth & Family Ministry: Crystal reported that this board will have joint meetings with the Christian Education board. They will be discussing the youth trip to New Orleans. She stated that the first day of Sunday school without Kelly went okay.

#### **Unfinished Business:**

- Elevator: Michael reported that the Otis elevator representative told him that they are waiting on one remaining component to be manufactured. Once they receive this part, repairs and updates to the elevator should begin.
- Stained Glass Windows: A downpayment was made at the end of December 2023 to lock in current pricing for the repair of the windows. Work on this project is scheduled to be done in 2025. Fundraising will continue in 2024. Pastor Lori is looking at two more grants to help pay for the window repairs.
- Church building use policy: Michael is working on a


guidance policy for groups that are not affiliated with St. Olaf but use our facilities for meetings, etc. He will work with Louise on this policy.

#### **New Business:**

- Pastor Lori, Crystal Eversvik, and Anne Rasmussen are reviewing and revising the job description for the Youth Ministry Coordinator. Pastor Lori will email this draft to the council members for review.
- Nominations for 2024 church council: President Michael Kitsch, VP vacant, Treasurer Mike Boehmer and Arne Berg, Secretary Colette Boehmer. Board chairs will remain the same Louise Oleson, Jeri Steffan, Crystal Eversvik, and Kristi Trottier. Vacancies Worship & Music, Church Properties.
- Louise moved that the St. Olaf church building/office be closed on days when the pastor and the office staff are absent from the facility. Mike seconded the motion. The council approved the motion.

The meeting was adjourned. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
