

FAITH MATTERS;

Suicide is a leading cause of death in the U.S., and suicide rates have increased in almost every state since 1999 (some by more than 30 percent), according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Suicide occurs among all demographics, including all religious groups. And behind these statistics are individualspeople who live in our families, communities and congregations and whose stories and relationships are unique and important.

With the knowledge of the statistics regarding suicide and being mindful of the lives affected, the ELCA Church Council adopted "Suicide Prevention" in 1999, a social message that calls on members, congregations and leaders to learn more about suicide prevention and what they can do to help. The social message calls us to this work as people of faith saying, "We who lean on God's love to live are called to 'bear one another's burdens and so fulfill the law of Christ' (Galatians 6:2). Our efforts to prevent suicide grow out of our obligation to protect and promote life, our hope in God amid suffering and adversity, and our love for our troubled neighbor."

In 2012, the ELCA Church Council adopted the social message "The Body of Christ and Mental Illness," which seeks to raise awareness of the challenges of mental illness, offer reflection and direction, and inspire action. At the 2016 Churchwide Assembly, a social policy resolution advocating for suicide prevention research was adopted.

Lutheran Suicide Prevention Ministry: With an inclusive and interfaith mission, the Lutheran Suicide Prevention Ministry's goal is zero suicides for all people, regardless of beliefs. The website includes resources for congregations, clergy and leaders, including lists of trusted faith-based mental health organizations.

National Suicide Prevention Lifeline: The Lifeline provides free, 24/7, confidential support for people in distress and advice for professionals. (800-273-8255)

National Alliance on Mental Illness: The nation's largest grassroots mental health organization provides information on warning signs and risk factors for suicide and resources for helping people with mental illnesses.

ELCA video message on suicide prevention: Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton shares a message of hope, saying, "Suicide can be prevented. We are never beyond God's mercy and compassion."

Elevator Update

The council decided at our May meeting that we will be starting a fund to help raise money to update the elevator. It will be set up just like the A/V fund so you can make special donations to a specific fund that will only be used to fund the elevator update. I have talked to a few other companies about elevator repairs and upkeep. Most of them do not have the time or are not willing to travel up to Devils Lake to complete maintenance or repairs. After getting the correct number to call, I decided to go with Otis for maintenance and updating. They answer when I call and show up that day or the day following. As I stated at the special meeting on April 30th, our elevator needs an ADA update to be tied to smoke alarms so no one gets stuck in the elevator and add other safety features that are out of date and could fail without the ability to repair. We have not signed any purchase agreements or anything like that. We are just starting to fund raise. The quote we had will be good for 90 days. Thank you.

The St. Olaf Lutheran Church council met on May 9, 2023.

President Michael Kitsch called the meeting to order at 7 pm. Pastor Lori opened with a thought provoking exercise based on Luke 4:21. We were asked to wonder about and notice the words in this verse. Pastor Lori also led

The minutes of the April church council meeting were reviewed. Mike moved to accept the minutes. Daria seconded. The minutes were approved.

Mike presented the Treasurer's report. Balances as of April 30, 2023: Designated Funds: \$107,381.42; Building Fund: 23,550.94; General Fund: \$1,250.16. Mike reported that the Audio/Visual project has been paid in full.

Monthly reports from Pastor Lori and Kelly were reviewed. The council was excited to hear about the increased number of baptisms happening at St. Olaf in 2023.

Church Properties: Michael reported that Karin Blanchfield has inquired about a date for outdoor cleaning at the Retreat Center. Follow up will be with Evonne Geigle and Allan Mosbaek.

Life in Ministry & Mission: Louise reported that following the special congregational vote the boards of Congregational LIfe, Lay Ministry, and Outreach & Evangelism will be combined to become the Board of Life in Ministry & Mission (LMM).

Worship & Music: Daria reported that this board met and has made some changes to their list of duties. Action was tabled until the next council meeting. They are preparing with Pastor Lori on music for summer services at the Retreat Center.

No reports from Christian Education, Stewardship, Youth & Family Ministry.

Unfinished Business: Michael reported on a bid from Associated Crafts & Willet Hauser Architectural Glass to repair the stained glass windows. As he indicated at the special congregational meeting the project cost is estimated at \$128,000, with 25% down to lock in this price and to guarantee a spot in line. Michael has been speaking with a representative from the Otis Elevator company to update and repair the elevator. The estimated cost to update the elevator would be \$78,000, with a 50% down payment. Mike made a motion to create an elevator fund to raise money to complete the necessary safety upgrades and repairs. Jeri seconded. Following discussion, the council approved the motion. Michael will include a report in the Spire about the elevator fund as approved by the council. Pastor Lori, Louise, and Colette will review the changes made to the St. Olaf constitution as voted on by the congregation. Following review the information will be given to Darci to make the changes to the constitution. Discussion on the St. Olaf website update will be tabled until the next council meeting.

New Business: Starting Sunday June 4 the services will be as follows: Retreat Center 8:30 and St. Olaf 11:00. Please sign up for the new church directory pictures -May 23,24,25.

The meeting was adjourned. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
